# Chapel Chat


The weekly news from Chapel St Leonards Primary School

This year the pupils in Year 6 will take their Standard Attainment Tests (SATs) on the dates below.

Monday 9th May	Grammar Test followed by: Spelling Test
Tuesday 10th May	Reading Test
Wednesday 11th May	Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic) followed by Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning)
Thursday 12th May	Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)

We do not want the pupils to become stressed or disenchanted with school during the build-up. As such we have explained that we do not mind how each pupil does so long as they try their hardest. The SATs are important as they are used to gauge future progress, especially in Year 11 (GCSE year). Doing well now is a firm foundation for the future.
