Our school COVID-19 risk assessment states that we must keep windows in classrooms open in order to aid ventilation and keep everyone as safe as possible. We need to continue to keep windows open even on the cooler days, we are allowed to have the heating on in classrooms though. For this reason, to ensure that the children are as warm as possible then we would like to ask parents/carers to consider an extra layer of clothing under t shirts and school jumpers (vest or t-shirt). Children will also be able to wear another layer on top of their jumper too (a coat or gilet would be perfect) if they feel cold during the day). **We will do our very best to make sure the children are not cold in their classrooms.
