Winter PE Kits

Remote Learning

Next week we will be sending out details to all families about how the school will continue to provide learning for pupils who are isolating at home due to COVID-19. This will explain what the school will put in place when a pupil, group of pupils or a whole class have to isolate. We will be using Microsoft Teams. We will also be adding more information on the school website to help parents with supporting their child to access the remote learning at home. If you do not have access to a suitable device (laptop or tablet) or an internet connection then you will need to inform the school of this when your child is told to isolate. We will then try to support you with this. It will be an expectation that children fully access ALL remote learning whilst isolating at home.

Whole School Attendance

Thank you to parents and carers for making sure their child attends school, on time each and everyday it makes a massive difference to the children's education.

Annual Flu Vaccination

Year 6

You should have received a letter regarding how to consent for your child to receive this year's flu vaccination. This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. The vaccination date allocated to our school is Thursday 19th November . You will need to enter the following code to ensure the completed form can be correctly allocated to your child's school: EE145489

The vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. This vaccine is a yearly vaccine. All vaccinated children will be given a sticker or an ink stamp on their hand. If you have any queries please contact the School Aged Immunisation Service on 01522 572950.

The NHS team do not send out reminders to parents so you do need to register your children now if you want them immunised this term.
