Achievement Assembly each Friday - even though we don't do this altogether in the Hall we are able





to see the children thriving in their classrooms and really engaging in their work.



Remote Learning

If we are informed to close a class due to a potential COVID-19 exposure all learning will take place remotely on Microsoft Teams with everyone (including staff) working from home. If individual children are self isolating at home we will make sure there is provision for remote learning in place whilst understanding our class teachers are still in school teaching. We will also



make arrangements for a School Meal Box for any children eligible for Free School Meals who are isolating due to potential exposure to a positive close contact or a positive test result.

Christmas Cards in School

Children are welcome to write Christmas cards to their friends and teachers this year as normal but due to the current situation we have to change the way they are delivered. As a result, all Christmas cards must be posted by **Friday 11th December** so that they can be left in quarantine over the weekend and then they will all be sorted and delivered during week beginning Monday 14th December. Unfortunately, any cards brought in after Friday 11th December will not be able to be delivered in school.
