## **Free School Meals**

We want to make sure as many eligible pupils as possible are claiming their free school meals, and we want to make it as easy as possible for parents. Free school meals offer a healthy, wide selection of options for your child at lunch time and can save families approximately £460 per year. If your child is in the infants and already has school meals, check to see if your child will continue to receive free school meals when they are older by applying. If you are unsure as to whether your child is eligible then you should apply anyway- this way you can ensure that your child is not missing out!
