

Favourite lesson: Maths - I love numbers.






Sports


This week's sports news: 12 from children from Y6, Y5, Y4 and Y3 have competed in a New-aged kurling competition with 3 teams and 4 in each.

All teams did extremely well with one team finishing first and another in fifth.


The winning team will now represent the school at the county games in July.


This week in year 5 they have been doing lots of fractions in maths.

This week in year 2 they have been drawing lots of things.




This week in year 1 they have been doing lots of English.
