

I would be grateful if you could consider your language and behaviour on the approach to school and near the school gate at the start and end of the day inevitably there will be lots of children entering or leaving the school and it is important that we set a good example with both our actions and words.

#### Attendance

190 DAYS 100%

In school for the full 190 days
100% attendance gives your child the best chance of success

180 DAYS 95% In school for 180 days = 10 days missed 95% attendance is the minimum target for all children

171 DAYS

In school for 171 days = 19 days missed

90% attendance is a concern and we meet with all families
and monitor this carefully as this = 4 weeks of school missed

161 DAYS 85% In school for 161 days = 29 days missed 85% is a worrying attendance record with almost 6 weeks missed. We will now request you attend a meeting.

152 DAYS 80% In school for 152 days = 38 days missed

We will now require you to work with us to improve your child's attendance before we take further action including an attedance panel meeting. This may include Fixed Penaly fines.
