



# Ear rings

Children should only wear studs in their ears. These will



need to be removed prior to the child being allowed to take part in PE. Staff are not allowed to help children remove or insert earrings, nor are they allowed to allow children to participate in PE with tape over their earrings.

If your child is having their ears pierced it is always best to do this at the start of the six week summer holidays that way on our return to school the ear rings can be removed and also the children have had time to practice.

Remember: No child is allowed to participate in PE should they be wearing earrings (even if they have been taped over).
